## **Daily Morning Prayer: Rite Two**

### **Processional Hymn- Hymnal 1982 #460 “Alleluia, Sing to Jesus”**

*The Officiant begins*

Send out your light and your truth, that they may lead me,  
and bring me to your holy hill and to your dwelling. *Psalm 43:3*

*The following Confession of Sin may then be said;*

### **Confession of Sin**

*The Officiant says to the people*

Dearly beloved, we have come together in the presence of Almighty God our heavenly Father, to set forth his praise, to hear his holy Word, and to ask, for ourselves and on behalf of others, those things that are necessary for our life

and our salvation. And so that we may prepare ourselves in heart and mind to worship him, let us kneel in silence, and with penitent and obedient hearts confess our sins, that we may obtain forgiveness by his infinite goodness and mercy.

*Silence may be kept.*

*Officiant and People together, all kneeling*

***Most merciful God,  
we confess that we have sinned against you  
in thought, word, and deed,  
by what we have done,  
and by what we have left undone.  
We have not loved you with our whole heart;  
we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves.  
We are truly sorry and we humbly repent.  
For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ,  
have mercy on us and forgive us;  
that we may delight in your will,  
and walk in your ways,  
to the glory of your Name. Amen.***

*The Officiant alone stands and says*

Almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us all our sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen us in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep us in eternal life. *Amen.*

*A deacon or lay person using the preceding form remains kneeling*

**The Invitatory and Psalter** *All stand*

*Officiant* Lord, open our lips.

*People* ***And our mouth shall proclaim your praise.***

*Officiant and People*

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: as

it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen.

*Except in Lent, add Alleluia.*

*Then follows one of the Invitatory Psalms, Venite or Jubilate.*

Worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness: Come let us adore him.

*All stand*

**Jubilate** *Psalm 100*

Be joyful in the Lord, all you lands; \*

***serve the Lord with gladness***

***and come before his presence with a song.***

Know this: The Lord himself is God; \*

***he himself has made us, and we are his;***

***we are his people and the sheep of his pasture.***

Enter his gates with thanksgiving;

go into his courts with praise; \*

***give thanks to him and call upon his Name.***

For the Lord is good;

his mercy is everlasting; \*

***and his faithfulness endures from age to age.***

**The Psalm Appointed**

**Psalm 34:1-8** *Benedicam Dominum*

1 I will bless the LORD at all times; \*

***his praise shall ever be in my mouth.***

2 I will glory in the LORD; \*

***let the humble hear and rejoice.***

3 Proclaim with me the greatness of the LORD; \*

***let us exalt his Name together.***

4 I sought the LORD, and he answered me \*

***and delivered me out of all my terror.***

5 Look upon him and be radiant, \*

*and let not your faces be ashamed.*

6 I called in my affliction and the LORD heard me \*

The angel of the LORD came a second time, touched him, and said, "Get up and eat, otherwise the journey will be too much for you." He got up, and ate and drank; then he went in the strength of that food forty days and forty nights to Horeb the mount of God.
